CIMVHR Welcomes the First Canadian Forces Chair in Military Trauma Research, Colonel Homer Tien

On July 3rd, the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of National Defence, Mr. Chris Alexander, presented Colonel Homer Tien with the Canadian Forces Major Sir Frederick Banting Term Chair in Military Trauma Research. Mr. Alexander stated feeling: "very proud that Colonel Tien's continuing work is being recognized, and that he is being extended this important opportunity as the first Canadian Forces Chair in Military Trauma Research."

Colonel Tien, a Canadian military trauma surgeon, is the current Medical Director of the Tory Regional Trauma Centre at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre and an associate scientist at Sunnybrook Research Institute. He has served in Bosnia with the Stabilization Force, in Kabul with the International Security Assistance Force, and has deployed multiple times to the Role 3 Multinational Medical Unit (MNU) in Kandahar.



The Surgeon General, Commodore Hans Jung foresaw positive results from this appointment: "Under the leadership of Colonel Tien, we will have the ability to further combine our efforts with other institutions in order to broaden our research capacity and to ensure better care for our military members and Veterans."
